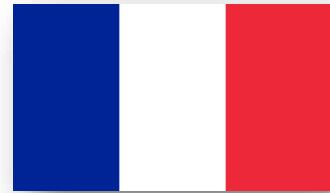

We **aren't** Spanish

She **isn't** from Mexico

To be (interrogative)

am	is	are
Am I...?	Is he ...? Is she ...? Is it ...?	Are we ...? Are you ...? Are they ...?

Are we Spanish? Yes, we **are**

Is she from Mexico? No, she **isn't**

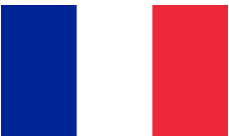
